Social-Emotional Learning and Character Development – promotes the healthy development of each child by teaching the habits of thoughtfulness and deeds that help people live and work together as families, friends, neighbors, communities and nations. Programs can reinforce core ethical values such as respect, responsibility and citizenship.

★ Provides experiences in areas of expression, identification of self-control methods, and supports learning how to resolve conflict without aggression. Additionally, it encourages generation of positive, effective solutions to problems.
