Wisconsin News& Legislative Updates:

- Key takeaways from Child Care Counts survey: As many as ¼ of Childcare Programs could close.
- Wisconsin DPI pushes back against USDE certification request
 - Read about potential impact on schools in Wisconsin
- From the Governor's budget: Four proven ways to invest in children
- The DPI recently allocated \$730,000 in federal grant funding to support 101 program sites through <u>Nita M. Lowey 21st Century</u> <u>Community Learning Centers</u>. This additional funding, an increase for

current grantees/sites, was allocated through the <u>LightBULB</u> (<u>Building Unity through Learning and Belonging Fund</u>) and will focus on critical areas of academic improvement, transportation challenges, and fostering a greater sense of belonging for students, and strengthening family engagement.

Federal Policy Updates & National News:

- Stay in the Loop: <u>Afterschool Alliance Update Email</u> <u>Congressional Activity</u>
 - Federal Budget and Appropriations:
 - FY25 Cuts Coming The Administration announced it will be sending a list of cuts to Congress for fiscal year 2025.
 Congress can pass these cuts with a simple majority. The letter is expected April 29.
 - FY26 Funding Requests: Congress has started working on the FY26 budget. Groups can request funding for key programs like 21st Century Community Learning Centers and AmeriCorps through May 23. *Check your Members of Congress' websites for forms.*
 - Reconciliation Process: Congress passed a budget blueprint calling for tax cuts, increased defense spending, and \$4 billion— \$1.5 trillion in unspecified cuts. This could impact programs like school meals, SNAP, TANF, and Medicaid. An <u>Afterschool</u> Alliance action alert is still live
 - New Bills Introduced:
 - Child Care Act: A bipartisan bill would help families pay for child care through the tax code. Get the details.
 - Youth Workforce Readiness Act: This bill <u>supports career</u> <u>education</u> in afterschool and summer programs starting in elementary school.

Administrative Updates

- President's Budget: A summary of the President's FY26 budget is expected this month, with the full proposal in May. Stay tuned for an Afterschool Alliance campaign website to counter cuts to programs that impact children and youth.
- HHS Budget Proposal: Reports suggest a proposed \$40 billion cut to the Department of Health and Human Services for FY26. While mainly focused on health programs, it includes eliminating Head Start. Child care funding (CCDBG) is expected to remain flat.
- AmeriCorps Changes: The National Civilian Conservation Corps (NCCC) has been abruptly shut down, with members sent home.
 Other AmeriCorps programs may also be at risk, though details are still unclear. Advocacy groups are urging action to protect these programs—reach out to your members of Congress to voice your opinion.

- Education Funding: The Department of Education has ended extensions for ESSER (COVID relief funds for schools).
- **DEI Crackdown in K-12 Schools**: The administration is pressuring states to end diversity programs in public schools or risk losing federal funding for low-income students. Legal challenges are underway, with a key case heard last week in New Hampshire.
